Mission Unstoppable: Proclaiming Jesus to the World

Understanding the content:

- 1. Read Acts Chapter 21-23 (a long section but it's well worth being across the narrative).
- 2. How does Paul's treatment at the hands of the Jews and the Romans contrast? Why is this contrast significant?
- 3. What is Paul's source of hope through all of his sufferings?
- 4. The Sanhedrin are unable to successfully prosecute Paul. What is their next plan for silencing him?
- 5. How does Paul escape the Jews?
- 6. Luke is not recording all of this information as a biography of Paul's life. What clues are there in the text that the life and ministry of Paul is not the most important topic (hint: look for the information that is/isn't included).

Take away points:

- 1. God's mission is unstoppable:
 - a. God had plans for Paul (see Acts 9:15-16 and Acts 23:11). How can you see these plans being realised?
 - b. Is there anything that is stopping God from fulfilling his plans?
 - c. Read Revelation 7:9-17. This reveals God's plan for humanity and his church. Will anything get in the way of this plan?
 - d. How does this encourage us to trust in God?

- 2. We are encouraged to persevere in telling others about Jesus:
 - a. Read Acts 21:10-14.
 - b. How are the experiences of Jesus and Paul in front of the Sanhedrin similar? (Luke 22:66-23:5, John 18:22-24, Acts 23:1-5).
 - c. Why might Luke want to draw similarity between the experiences of Jesus and Paul?
 - d. Luke presents Paul as a role model to follow. How can this encourage us in our own evangelism?

Reflect:

- 1. Does it honestly seem to you like God's mission is unstoppable? Do you trust Him?
- 2. Are you participating in God's mission?
- 3. Are you persevering in telling others about Jesus?
